North Carolina General Statute 93B-2(e) requires that "each State agency licensing board shall file electronically with the Secretary of State, the Attorney General, and the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedures Oversight Committee an annual report containing all of the following information:

- (1) The number of applicants for a license and, of that number, the number granted a license.
- (2) The number of applicants with a conviction record and, of that number, the number granted a license, denied a license for any reason, and denied a license because of a conviction."

The Boiler Safety Bureau of the N.C. Department of Labor is the only division within the department that meets the definition of "State agency licensing board."

The North Carolina Uniform Boiler and Pressure Vessel Act (Article 7A, Chapter 95) authorizes the department to issue, suspend or revoke inspector's commissions. These commissions are issued on the calendar year. For calendar year 2019, the Boiler Safety Bureau:

- (1) Issued 148 inspector commissions (all that applied) including:
 - Six (6) new inspector commissions and three (3) inspector commission renewals (for individuals who been inactive for more than one year)
- (2) Did not collect information regarding the criminal background of applicants.
