General Industry, Construction, Agriculture, and Maritime
Final Rule

DISCUSSION:

On July 19, 1994, Federal OSHA promulgated a new occupational safety and health standard for General Industry, Construction, Agriculture, Shipyard Employment and Marine Terminals. This final rule, *Retention of DOT Markings, Placards and Labels*, becomes effective on the federal level on October 17, 1994.

This standard requires employers to retain Department of Transportation labeling on packages, freight containers, motor vehicles, rail freight cars, or transport vehicles containing hazardous materials until the packaging is sufficiently cleaned of residue and purged of vapors to remove any potential hazards. The federal rule was congressionally mandated by the Hazardous Materials Transportation Uniform Safety Act.

OSHA regulations include separate but identical standards for general industry, construction, agriculture, shipyards, and. marine terminals.

ACTION:

This final rules at 29 CFR 1910, 1915, 1917, 1926 and 1928 were adopted verbatim in North Carolina by the Commissioner of Labor with an effective date of November 1, 1994. A copy of the regulatory text from the [Federal Register](#) announcement (Vol. 59, No. 137) is attached.
